## **Finance**

Ideas for fund-raising are being put forward, including encouraging members to consider adding a gift to St Mary's in their will. We are planning a Stewardship Sunday later in the year. Friends of St Mary's is being re-launched to raise funds for repairs and maintenance of the church building.

## **Reports from Working Groups**

<u>Children, Families and Youth</u> – St Mary's Toddlers on Wednesdays continues to be appreciated by parents, carers and children. Rev'd David visits the primary school on a regular basis and Rosemary Colebourn is working with the Eco Co-ordinator of King's Academy. She arranged a successful school choir visit to Coffee break in December.

Many families attended the nativity service, Christingle and carol services.

<u>Pastoral Care</u> - Winter Warmers monthly Friday lunches are appreciated by those who attend, and will continue until the clocks change to summer-time.

<u>Worship</u> – Creation Sunday will be on February 23<sup>rd</sup>. Weekday afternoon courses have been planned until the end of June and include the current six-week course on 'The Lord's Prayer', a six-week Lent course from March 6<sup>th</sup>, a six-week Ecothemed course "Tenants of the King" from June 5<sup>th</sup> and a 'read through' Bible Study from June 12<sup>th</sup>. From June 5<sup>th</sup> Rev'd Pat will also lead an evening house group for those less used to our usual study groups. Our Festival Evensong will be on 29<sup>th</sup> lune.
